ENTRY CRITERIA

GCSE

All entrants will have attained a minimum grade C in GCSE English, mathematics and science or equivalent examinations.

Entrants must hold a degree from a United Kingdom university (or Higher Education Institution), or a degree from the CNAA, or a recognised equivalent qualification.

For entrants with degrees from overseas, please contact NARIC (National Academic Recognition Information Centre) on 0870 990 4088 to obtain written confirmation of equivalency.
