We are pleased to be launching our very own mobile phone APP for both Apple and Android phones. This should be rolled out to all parents of students in Y7 - Y10 by this week. A lot of parents now have the APP downloaded and are able to use it to track attendance and notify absences, track house-points and gain other useful information.

It is really important that all parents have the APP downloaded as this will become our main point of communication as we move into school year 25-26. It will allow:

- **Community posts** – catch up with the latest news and events
- **Direct messages** – receive important announcements straight to your phone
- **House Point information** – see the rewards your child has earned
- **Attendance data** – view daily attendance and report absences in seconds
- **Academic reports** – follow your child’s progress through clear, concise updates. This will be the place we issue future academic reports.
- **School Information** – see key information about the school including holiday dates, and times of the day.

If you have any difficulty downloading the Cardinal Hume parent APP please do get in touch with the school so we can help you resolve any problems.

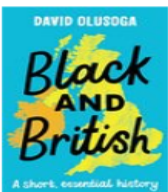

Library Parent Bulletin

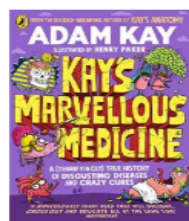
